# There is a Province-Wide **OPEN FIRE Ban on NOW!!!**

To report a wildfire or irresponsible behaviour call 1 800 663-5555 or \*5555 from a cell phone.

All calls are answered by BC Wildfire Service staff at the Provincial Forest Fire Reporting Centre. Any information you can provide is helpful, however you can expect the emergency call taker to ask for details about the fire, such as;

- Location (nearest Telephone or Hydro pole number if near a road)
- i.e. Where is the fire? How far up the hillside/into the bush?
- Size: e.g. Metres? Hectares? Size of a house? Size of a football field?
- Rate of spread i.e. How quickly is the fire spreading?
- Fuel i.e. What is burning? Grass, bushes, trees?
- Smoke/flames i.e. What colour is the smoke? Are flames visible?
- Threat i.e. Are there any people or buildings at risk?
- •Action i.e. Is anyone fighting the fire?

ALSO Call 911 as this will advise Quadra Fire as well If possible also advise your NEPP leader and Steve Peterson AND Judy Hagen 250-285-2150 or Betty Doak 250-285 3590 Please be extra careful out there. Fires start easily and can spread fast when we get one of those strong north winds. Also remember that the

undercarriage of your vehicle is hot and can ignite dry grass. For further information please check the article by Mike Gall in the last edition of the DI, June 31.

### **Quadra Island Evacuation Procedures.**

With the fire situation in the Interior of the Province and many weeks of dry, hot weather before us, please take time to review your preparedness for emergencies. Preparedness

Check your Grab'n'Go bag. Does it contain up to date medications, copies of original documents (SIN #, passport, banking info, insurance info, contact numbers local and out of province, cash in small notes, etc.)?

Review your insurance coverage. Keep gas tank half full at all times. Pet requirements (food, medication if needed, name of vet)

Sign up with https:// strathconard.connectrocket.com for free Emergency Notifications

#### **Emergency Alert**

Police or fire dept. personnel will knock on your door and give estimate of time you may have before you leave. Call/text from Strathcona **Emergency Notifications.** 

Make list of things to do before you leave.





Pack vehicle with other essentials such as camping gear, food, extra clothing, pet cages (especially for cats), medical necessities, computer and hard drive, valuables, etc.

Contact family, friends, etc. and decide where you will go.

#### **Evacuation Order**

Follows instructions from person advising you of the order.

At bottom of the evacuation order is information regarding location of Reception Centre being used.

Check with neighbours who might not have transportation. Switch off and unplug electrical appliances, turn off water and gas. Gas can only be turned back on by a professional gas fitter. Close windows.

Leave one outside light on to alert BC Hydro as to whether you have power.

Advise family members not at home where you are going. Follow signed evacuation route and directions of emergency personnel.

Centre to register re your plans and obtain vouchers if you need accommodation

Please be aware that if we have to evacuate large numbers of people off island, vehicles will probably be left behind. Ensure you can carry your essentials like the Grab'n'Go bag.

If you do not evacuate when requested you are endangering the lives of our police and Fire Dept. who may make a second visit under more dangerous conditions.

Northern Strait of Georgia **Cetacean Census** 

### August 5-7,2017


The BC Cetacean Sightings Network is asking all coastal residents for their help in gathering whale, dolphin, and porpoise (cetacean) and sea turtle sightings observed in the Northern Strait of Georgia (French Creek/Madeira Park to northern Quadra Island) over the August long weekend. A localized blitz-style census effort from citizen scientists will help provide valuable information on how cetaceans use this area. Census-style data collection has a rich history in B.C. In the early 1970s, Dr. Michael Bigg of Fisheries and Oceans Canada was asked to count the number of wild killer whales along the coast of B.C. To get a quick estimate of the killer whale population, Dr. Bigg conducted a public census, and the response was hugely successful. In 1971, thanks to reports from the public, Dr. Bigg established an estimate of approximately 550 killer whales from southeast Alaska to California; an estimate that was proven to be highly accurate. The results put a permanent end to the capture of killer whales in Canada and the U.S.

Since Dr. Bigg's census, keen members of the public have continued to report sightings of cetaceans and sea turtles in

B.C. In 1999, the B.C. Cetacean Sightings Network was established, and continues to maintain these data in one place, and in a consistent format that makes it valuable and available to researchers, NGOs and government.

This year the Sightings Network is bringing back Dr. Bigg's blitz-style weekend census with the aim of gathering specific valuable information about how cetaceans use the Northern Strait of Georgia. We hope you will join us on August 5-7 2017!






#### You can help save our whales British Columbia's killer whales are beloved and crucial members of our communities who compel and fascinate us. They are an integral part of the histories and cultures of the coast. As summer heats up, it's important to recognize how much danger they are in, the things we do that contribute to the problem, and what we can do to help.

British Columbia is home to many marine mammals including two unique sub-species of killer whales, the Southern and Northern Residents. The whales' home is located in one of the busiest shipping routes in the world. These waters see around 11,000 large vessels transiting each year, and countless smaller vessels. The Northern Resident Killer Whales, whose territory runs from northern Georgia Strait through Johnstone Strait, are listed as threatened. The Southern Resident Killer Whales, whose habitat goes from southern Georgia Strait through Juan de Fuca Strait, are listed as endangered.

Almost 10 per cent of the total number of Southern Residents died just last year, including a mother and calf who starved to death, a male who died from a vessel impact, and Granny, the world's oldest known orca. There are now only 78 left in existence.

Vessel traffic, from tankers to cruise ships to whale-watchers to private boats and kayaks, is hounding the whales to death, through noise and through proximity. Coastal BC's waterways are getting busier every year, with the waters around Victoria being the busiest

Acoustical disturbance causes deafening noise that interferes with echolocation; physical disruption creates obstacles requiring valuable energy be expended for avoidance. Marine traffic distracts whales from critical activities like foraging, eating, breeding, and socializing. Noise created by motor boats disrupts their ability to hunt, communicate, and navigate. With increasing demands from commercial, tourism, and recreational sectors for access to the fragile habitat of these endangered animals, the crisis facing resident killer whales requires urgent intervention.

The good news is saving these whales is completely within our control. While an increase in large vessels is harmful, smaller boats cause the majority of disturbances.

(1) Community Living British Columbia-email CLBCinfo@gov.bc.ca. or call toll free 1-877-660-2522-- They are located throughout B.C. & provide contacts in your region. (2) Service B.C. can be reached toll free at 1-800-663-7867 Monday-Friday -- They will assist with driver's license renewals and other info. They're located in larger cities in B.C.. (3) Service Canada is available toll free at 1-800-277-9974 If you require "Confirmation

of Current Status ( when you receive Guaranteed Income Supplement)-- for a possible discount at various Recreation Centres for public swimming, etc.--Contact the Recreation Centre nearest you.

(4) Low- income seniors may benefit from knowing about the following programs. Please note-- It is VERY IMPORTANT to file your taxes every year, as it will impact your ability to receive or continue receiving certain benefits.

(5) Guaranteed Income Supplement--(GIS) provides a monthly non-taxable benefit to low income Old Age Security (OAS) pension recipients living in Canada. To find out if you qualify--or confirm receipt of the GIS, please call Service Canada at 1-800-277-9914.

(6) Medical Services Plan (MSP) Premium Assistance. Low- income seniors in British Columbia qualify for assistance with MSP payments. If your annual income is less than \$42,000 and if you are paying \$75 per month for your MSP (or \$150 for a couple) then you may qualify for assistance.

If you paid the full premium for any or all of the last 6 years and your income was <\$30,000 you may be eligible for a refund.

(7) Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER)---toll free 1-800-257-7756 Are you 60 or older? Do you pay rent or paid rent? Have you lived in B.C. for the last 12 months- Do you have a GROSS monthly income of \$ 2,223 (single) or \$2,423 (double)--if You answered YES to these questions, you may be eligible for SAFER, a rent subsidy program that provides monthly cash payments to subsidize rents for eligible seniors.
