

Boom to Bust!

Phew, what a temperature change...if they hadn't bolted before, they certainly did on the Mother's Day weekend! Away went the radishes and komatsuna. Oh well, out with the old and in with the new crop of carrots.

Unfortunately, our night time lows aren't living up to the day time highs. In my microclimate, the lows have gone down to FOUR! degrees celsius and that just isn't warm enough for the heat loving crops, never mind the Giant Pumpkins, and this is June! Tomatoes and members of the cucurbit family, squashes and cucumbers, simply won't grow happily in the garden until the nights are staying 10°C.

The second problem is that these are very fast growing seedlings and do not like to get too crowded. So, if they are left in containers too long they may become root bound and stunted. If your plants are now beyond their third true leaf and simply must be put out into the garden, then they must be protected with whatever imaginative structure that you can muster to hold the heat in around them. (Hmmm, sounds like a good category for the Fall Fair!) And if you have been able to wait until now to plant out, make sure that the soil is moist (but not soggy) in both the pots the seedlings are coming out of, AND the ground they are going into. It is amazing how quickly things have dried out in the lovely weather. Take care not to damage the roots, and plant them at the end of the day (or on a cloudy day) giving them time to settle and lessen the shock of transplanting. Bring on the warmer nights!!



If don't know a wood supplier, ask a neighbour. Word of mouth advertising is often the best. Or try calling Keith at 285-2722 or Billy at 285-3714. Rates often vary from \$170 to \$200 a cord.

We are now preparing for next winter. We need wood cutters, both chain saw and axe, and offers of easily reachable wood to stock our supply for next winter. (Unfortunately, we don't have the ability to more large logs of wood)

Campbell River Waste Management Centre Celebrates Project Completion



The Comox Strathcona waste management (CSWM) service is inviting residents to come celebrate the completion of the new transfer station and recycling area at the Campbell River waste management centre on Friday, June 15 from 2 - 5 p.m.

This is an opportunity for residents to become familiar with the changes, which includes a new transfer station building and a new and improved recycling area. The transfer station hosts two large bays for receiving all nonrecyclable household waste, residential roofing materials, clean wood waste (unpainted lumber, pallets, wood shingles) and yard waste contained in bio-degradable bags. And the recycling area has been equipped with bins for the return of cardboard, mixed paper, recyclable plastics, tires, propane tanks, household and automotive batteries, appliances, scrap metal, used oil, electronic items and household hazardous waste.

"Household hazardous waste is any waste from your home that you consider to be dangerous or are unsure of its contents," said Jesse Lee, assistant manager of Strathcona solid waste services. "If Campbell River bottle depot does not accept it through their 'Product Care' program then residents can drop it off here."

On Friday, June 15th CSWM staff and the centre's contract operators will be onsite to welcome visitors, give them a tour and answer any questions about the recent changes. The Campbell River waste management centre is located at 6700 Argonaut Road.

The regular hours of operation are 8:30 – 5:30 p.m. seven days a week – open on all statutory holidays except for Christmas Day and New Year's Day. A photo album of the site changes has been added to the CSWM website and can be viewed by visiting www.cswm.ca/ crlandfill.

The Comox Strathcona Waste Management (CSWM) service is a function of the Comox Valley Regional District (CVRD) and is responsible for two regional waste management centres that serve the Comox Vallev and Campbell River, as well as a range of transfer stations and smaller waste-handling and recycling facilities for the electoral areas of the CVRD and the Strathcona Regional District. The CSWM service manages over 100,000 tonnes of waste and recycled material and oversees a number of diversion and education programs.


