# Community paramedicine expands throughout British Columbia

VICTORIA - Health Minister Terry Lake has announced the 73 rural and remote B.C. communities that will welcome community paramedicine, a program that offers residents enhanced health services from paramedics. [including Quadra and Cortes Islands]

"The Community Paramedicine Initiative is a key component of our plan to improve access to primary health-care services in rural B.C.," Lake said. "By building upon the skills and background of paramedics, we are empowering them to expand access to care for people who live in rural and remote communities, helping patients get the care they need closer to home."

The program is just one way the Province is working to enhance the delivery of primary care services to British Columbians. The services provided may include checking blood pressure, assisting with diabetic care, helping to identify fall hazards, medication assessment, post-injury or illness evaluation, and assisting with respiratory conditions.

Under this program, paramedics will provide basic health-care services, within their scope of practice, in partnership with local healthcare providers. The enhanced role is not intended to replace care provided by health professionals such as nurses, but rather to complement and support the work these important professionals do each day, delivered in non-urgent settings, in patients' homes or in the community.

"As a former BC Ambulance paramedic, I understand the potential benefits of community paramedicine," said Jordan Sturdy, MLA for West Vancouver-Sea to Sky. "Expanding the role of paramedics to help care for the health and well-being of British Columbians just makes sense."

Community paramedicine broadens the traditional focus of paramedics on prehospital emergency care to include disease prevention, health promotion and basic health-care services. This means a paramedic will visit rural patients in their home or community, perform assessments requested by the referring health-care professional, and record their findings to be included in the patient's file. They will also be able to teach skills such as CPR at community clinics.

"Community paramedics will focus on helping people stay healthy and the specific primary care needs of the people in these communities," said Linda Lupini, executive vice president, BC Emergency Health Services. "This program also allows us to enhance our ability to respond to medical emergencies by offering permanent employment to paramedics in rural and remote areas of the province."

"Community paramedicine brings improved patient care and more career opportunities to rural and remote areas," said Bronwyn Barter, president, Ambulance Paramedics of BC (CUPE 873). "Paramedics are well-suited to take on this important role in health-care provision."

Community paramedicine was initially introduced in the province in 2015 in nine prototype communities. The initiative is now expanding provincewide, and will be in place in 31 communities in the Interior, 18 communities in northern B.C., 19 communities on Vancouver Island, and five communities in the Vancouver coastal area this year.

At least 80 new full-time equivalent positions will support the implementation of community paramedicine, as well as augment emergency response capabilities. Positions will be posted across the regional health authorities. The selection, orientation and placement process is expected to take about four months.

Community paramedics are expected to be delivering community health services in northern B.C. this fall, in the Interior in early 2017, on Vancouver Island and the Vancouver coastal area in the spring of 2017.

BC Emergency Health Services has been coordinating the implementation of community paramedicine in B.C. with the Ministry of Health, regional health authorities, the Ambulance Paramedics of BC (CUPE 873), the First Nations Health Authority and others.

# Editor,

Concerning the proposal for a park along the central ridgeline of Quadra Island: we simply DO NOT need another park and yet another reduction in the land base available for low-intensity logging. The status quo with availability to all on what is Crown Land allows recreational pursuits and patch logging on the lower slopes in areas other than the riparian zones around streams, wetlands and lakes.

The roads and trails allowing access to these areas have been built by loggers in the past and will be in the future. Park status would help eliminate employment with no increase in tourism or advantage to anyone.

On a related topic I found the complaint about the noise and pollution from tugs in Gowlland Harbour a bit bizarre. Tugs get quieter and less polluting every year, and Glen Wheeter's tugs (Gowlland Towing, main TimberWest contractor) are mostly near new. The coal mine is currently shut down, so loading wouldn't be making noise. Perhaps waterfront living by a 100 plus year old booming ground isn't for everyone (I have lived on Gowlland Harbour for 25 years).

The message for Quadra Island living seems to be to try and get along with the balance of employment and recreation that exists and don't pander only to selfish self-interest.



# **Emergency Preparedness Day**

# Saturday May 7, 1000 - 1300 hours Fire Hall #1

Emergencies of any kind will strain our communication abilities. We need to be in touch with family and friends to assure them of our safety and check on theirs. We rely on technology more and more to keep in touch with our family, friends, and colleagues with a click of a button. But what happens in the event of a major emergency? Suddenly these tools can become vital in helping you and your family get in touch and stay informed. So here are some tips on the use of technology in an emergency:

- If possible, use non-voice channels like text messaging, email or social media. These use less bandwidth than voice communications and may work even when phone service doesn't.
- If you must use a phone, keep your conversation brief and convey only vital information to emergency personnel and/or family. This will also conserve your phone's battery.
- Unable to complete a call? Wait 10 seconds before redialing to help reduce network congestion. Note, cordless phones rely on electricity and will not work during a power outage. If you have a land-line, keep at least one corded phone in your home.
- Keep extra batteries or a charger for your mobile device in your emergency kit. Consider getting a solar-powered, crank, or vehicle phone charger. If you don't have a cell phone, keep a prepaid phone card in your emergency kit.
- Keep your contacts up to date on your phone, email and other channels. This will make it easier to reach important contacts, such as friends, family, neighbours, child's school, or insurance agent.
- If you have a smartphone, save your safe meeting location(s) on its mapping application.
- Conserve your smartphone's battery by reducing the screen's brightness, placing your phone in airplane mode, and closing apps you are not using. You never know how long a power outage will last!

Remember, in an emergency or to save a life, call 9-1-1 for help.

You cannot currently text 9-1-1. If you are not experiencing an emergency, do not call 9-1-1.

If the above has made you think about how prepared your family is, come to the Emergency Preparedness Day.

Find out how well Quadra Island is prepared and what you can do to improve your own preparedness.

Can you use a fire extinguisher properly? Do you have NEPP in your neighbourhood? How do you find out which route is safe in a disaster? Is your Grab 'n' Go bag ready with everything you might need? Have you an up to date medication list in there and some meds? How easily will first responders find you? How will they know if you need help?

Not only can you find the answers to these questions and many more at the Fire Hall on May 7 but the Fire Dept. are holding one of their famous barbecues. Be there. It may save your life.

# REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT • by Jim Abram

ell here we are already at the end of April! That was fast! Many days were taken up by meetings here on Quadra, in Campbell River and other cities. Sure made the month go by quickly. Lots got done and more is in the works.

# **UBCM Advocacy days**

Last week I spent four days with the entire UBCM Executive in Victoria meeting in groups with about 20 Ministers and MLA's.

It is our practice now to take our April Executive meeting directly to government in Victoria and pursue all of the policies that the membership has decided at last September's Convention. So, we did that and had a good tag-team effort with everyone we could get in to see. It was exhausting but worthwhile to meet face to face on our issues. Time will tell if it did any good. There is an election coming up and we always snuck that into the conversations. It never hurts!

# Some Ferry information

I was confronted on the ferry last Thursday with the suggestion that I never tell the people of Quadra Island about why the Ambulance will not do after-hour runs using the ferry.

This comment was of course baseless since I have brought up the issue with the public, the ferry corporation, the FAC, the Ambulance unit, here and in Victoria, and even the Minister. I have reported their lame excuses over and over in my Reports and I am pretty sure that the population knows that we are at the mercy of the BCFS and Ambulance bureaucracy as to whether or not they will sail after hours.

They give us excuses of not enough crew on Quadra, not enough of the right level of crew, etc. It is all nonsense and I am not here to discuss it at this time. I just want to know that you know that we are at their mercy and I want you to tell me that you already knew that. Our Ferry Advisory Committee, our emergency crews and myself have been telling you that for at least two years if not longer. So, there, I have said it again.

# Association of Vancouver Island & Coastal Communities (AVICC)

I also recently attended the annual AVICC Convention in Nanaimo for three days to deal with all of the coastal issues that we are all faced with. It was one of the better meetings in the past few years. Some good workshops were presented

and we got to hear some good speakers including our Minister, the Leader of the Opposition & the Leader of the BC Green Party.

The main resolution that we presented on stopping the pay parking idea at our new hospitals was defeated by the delegation. This was mainly due to the large centres like Nanaimo and Victoria that now pay and want to see that money go into the pot. The sad thing about the situation is that the excess revenue does not go into health care but into general revenue. In the mean time the unfortunate in our catchment area will be forced to add one more level of stress to their emergency visits to the hospital. We have no intention of giving up.

#### Alternate Director fill-in

I was very fortunate to have my capable Alternate Director to fill in for me at a couple of meetings while I was away at UBCM. Dan MacKenzie and I went over each agenda before I left and he was totally prepared for what he might face at the Board. He did a great job and will be attending two more meetings in the coming months. This time it will be because Wendy and I need a bit of time off. It has been an incredibly stressful and issue filled year and we need to recharge. Dan will be filling in for meetings but is not available for daily business. Save that for my return. I wouldn't wish that upon anyone!

# Dog By-Law

The Dog By-Law will have been presented to the Board by the time you read this has been in the works for about two years and I have reported to you every time it came up at the staff or board level. The by-law that will be before us will be to establish the service, not all the details. First we need to establish the service and then we work out details. There will be lots of time for your input into this long awaited by-law. Stand by!

# 11th Annual Broom Pull at Rebecca Spit

Once again local volunteers who love this little park will gather to pull what broom remains to be pulled. Those seeds do keep sprouting! 

# **Blood Donation**

here has been recent discussion regarding blood donation on island. Unfortunately, Canadian Blood Services is not able to come to more rural communities but does come to Campbell River regularly every two months or so at the community centre. Anyone can donate blood but there are some exceptions. One has to be in good health, have no current infections, age 17 or older (height and weigh requirements), with a controlled blood pressure. Individuals must wait for one year after receiving a blood transfusion before they can donate. One must also wait six months after receiving a tattoo or a body piercing. Similarly, one must wait for 3 weeks after travelling outside of Canada, continental USA and/or Europe. There is a full list of restrictions on-line at the website listed below. One can donate blood every 56 days for whole blood, 7 days for platelets and two weeks for plasma (latter two blood components).

When you go to donate blood your blood type will be identified. Although simplified here, there are four major blood types: A, B, AB and O. Your blood type is passed down to you from your parents, and you maintain this for life. Determining your blood type involves identifying a protein or antigen that is on your red blood cell. If you are type A, you have antigen A but also antibodies against type B blood. Thus if you are given blood that is type B, the antibodies you carry attack the type B and it is destroyed. This is deemed incompatible. if you are type B you have antigen B but antibodies to type A. If you are type AB, you have both antigens A or B but you have no antibodies. Type AB is called the universal recipient because they can get blood from any of the other blood types. However, no other group than AB can get AB blood. Type O blood contains no antigens but does have antibodies to both A and B. Type O can be given to any blood group: it is deemed the universal donor. Individuals with type O blood can only receive the same. AB appears to be the rarest of blood types followed by B, then O.

When your blood is typed, it is also identified as Rh (meaning rhesus) positive or negative. Rh is also a protein on the surface of a red blood cell, either you have it (Rh positive) or you do not (Rh negative. This factor is also inherited. Rh positive is most common. Thus if your blood type is A you are either A positive or A negative. This follows for all the other 3 types. Generally speaking, Rh factor becomes a big concern in pregnancy. If the Mother is Rh negative and the Father is Rh positive, the baby can be Rh positive. During pregnancy and birth, there is potential for blood from the Rh positive baby to mix with the Mother's Rh negative blood with the end result that the Mother develops antibodies to the Rh positive blood. These antibodies

can cause blood clotting issues for this child or subsequent children born to this Mother. Most Rh negative woman receive something called rhogram both during and after their pregnancies to prevent the development of antibodies.

Blood is a precious gift to donate. In island health alone, there are 22,000 units of blood components and 23,000 vials of plasma derivatives used yearly for over 7,000 recipients at a cost of \$22,000,000. Virtually all whole blood donated is broken down into separate components such as packed red blood cells (contains hemoglobin) plasma (serum in blood, contains clotting factors), cryoprecipitate (further reduction of plasma that contains certain clotting factors used for individuals with specific clotting disorders such as hemophilia) or platelets (clots blood). This way individuals receive only the component that they need at the time and lessens the burden on the blood bank. People receive transfusions for many reasons: blood loss during surgery, blood loss from trauma/ burns, cancer patients and others who may not be able to make their own blood, or those with a blood disorder. If you need elective surgery and have the potential to need blood, discuss this with your family practitioner. You may be able to donate your own blood before the surgery for use if needed.
