### **Electoral Reform**

MP RACHEL BLANEY HOSTS FIRST OF FOUR TOWN HALL MEETINGS ON ELECTORAL REFORM

COMOX - An enthusiastic and inquisitive group of citizens gathered at Comox Community Centre on Saturday to hear about and discuss changes to Canada's voting system with North Island-Powell River MP Rachel Blaney.

Blaney, along with resident voting systems expert Jamie Deith, presented and answered questions on the review process currently under way, and the strengths and weaknesses of some of the voting systems and variations under consideration.

"The Liberals were clear that 2015 would be the last election using first-past-thepost. We want to make sure they honour that promise, and that what we bring in is a system that fairly reflects the values and intentions of voters in our riding and across the country," said Blaney.

Blaney will be hosting three more town halls and continue to collect input from constituents until early October.

### **Protection for LGBTQ**

VICTORIA— After years of advocating for B.C. schools to have explicit policies to protect LGBTQ youth, the B.C. Liberals finally relented and announced changes, say New Democrats.

"LGBTQ youth face much higher rates of violence, bullying and suicide and need help to succeed in our schools. But for years while New Democrats were advocating for protections for these vulnerable youth, Christy Clark said no, even though other provinces were taking the lead," said New Democrat MLA Spencer Chandra Herbert.

After years of pressure put on by New Democrats led by the efforts of Chandra Herbert, along with advocates, the government finally announced it will put in the necessary policies to ensure that LGBTQ youth in schools are protected.

"For years Christy Clark's government said that protections for sexual orientation was not an issue. Had she put these protections in earlier we could have protected many young people from violence and bullying," said Chandra Herbert. "With the election coming up, Christy Clark is finally reversing her position and putting these protections in place. I'm thankful that the hard work from parents, teachers, students and New Democrats is finally being recognized."

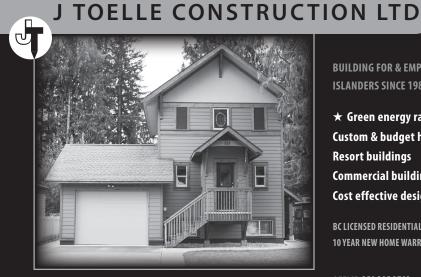

I own a PWC which I use to commute to Campbell River for work. It is an inexpensive, fuel efficient alternative to relying on B.C. Ferries. I am always very conscientious around all other people and watercraft around me. When I do use the boat launch at Drew Harbour, it is only as a means to get to other island destinations.

I have a P.O. box in Q. cove, and have not received any surveys regarding the use of jet skis in the waters on and around Quadra. I called the offices of The Comox-Strathcona Regional District (250-830-6700) and was told that "there is no record of any surveys banning jet skis in the The Comox-Strathcona Regional District."

I cannot speak for others, but I think that if you would like to start a conversation about banning any type of small watercraft in all the fresh and salt water on and around Quadra, it is only fair to poll all residents concerned and to use accurate and current data in your arguments.

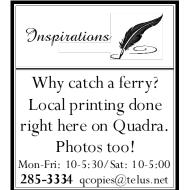

### **Somatics Workshop**

Sunday, October 16, 10 am-1 pm Quadra Island Community Center Upstairs, Room 3

Are you experiencing muscular and/or joint pain?

Limited mobility and range of motion, sore neck, shoulder, back or hips?

Somatics teaches that most of these types of conditions are symptoms of functional problems that can be resolved. Learn how to regain control of your body with simple, gentle movements to release persistent muscle and fascial tension. Somatic movement can reduce or eliminate chronic pain, increase flexibility, improve alignment and posture and restore vitality.

As part of the ongoing focus on mental health, the Quadra mental health task group is presenting a workshop open to anyone who is ready to take control of their own physical health. It is particularly relevant for those with chronic pain. We have invited Rob Selmanovic of Soulworks Body Wisdom on Cortes Island to provide a three-hour workshop on Somatics.

Somatics is a safe gentle system of neuromuscular movements that work to relieve pain and free up movement by re-educating the nervous system to release muscle tension.

In the 3-hour workshop you will learn:

- (i) the most common muscle reflex patterns that you may be "locked" in
- (ii) how to resolve sensory motor amnesia that is causing restriction of movement, misalignment and functional limitations
- (iii) an alternative to stretching that incorporates the brain and nervous system to re-educate the body
- (iv) several somatic neuromuscular movements and exercises that you can do at home.

The cost of the workshop, which includes theory and practice, is \$40.00 per person. Participants must pre-register at the Quadra Island Medical Clinic or the Cape Mudge Band Office (see Patty Wilson). Space is limited. A \$20.00 deposit is required to hold your space.

Quadra Circle has some limited funding for those who may be monetarily challenged. Please drop into the Quadra Circle community connections center (next to Quadra Island Medical Clinic) to enquire about this. All attendees need to bring a yoga mat or blanket, a cushion or pillow, water, as well as comfortable clothing suitable for movement. Open to all body types and abilities. Not suitable if you are unable to get up and down from the floor.

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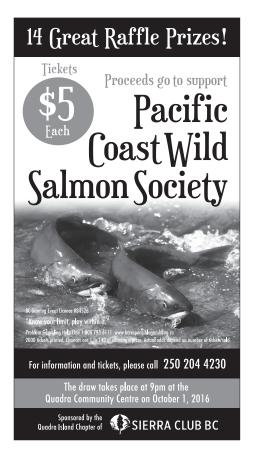

# **Beating the Back-to-School Germs**

Parents know the return to school usually brings coughs, colds, sniffles and other illnesses. But have you stopped to think about how these nasty germs are getting into your kids and your home?

Kids are commonly exposed to a big list of contagious germs: colds, respiratory viruses, strep throat, influenza, hand, foot, and mouth disease, and much more. Consider how much work you and your family miss due to illness, either to take care of a sick child or getting sick yourself, and it is easy to see the value in taking some extra time to set up preventative routines!

Island Health Medical Health Officer Dr. Dee Hoyano is a mom of school aged kids, and her best stay healthy advice to her kids is around hand washing. "When you think about how much equipment is shared at school, it is no wonder that illness spreads quickly," she says. "Kids should get in the habit of washing or disinfecting their hands not just around mealtimes and using the bathroom, but also at other transitions during the day."

Key hand washing times should include:

- · After gym class or playing outdoors
- · First thing after coming home from school/work/play outside
- · Before and after eating
- · After using the bathroom

Recent studies have shown high levels of potentially harmful bacteria on items like reusable water bottles and lunch bags, backpacks, smartphones and other handheld technology. There are germs lurking in many of the items that come home every day, and we don't often think to give them a wash.

"Lunchbags and water bottles should be cleaned regularly," says Hoyano. "It is a good idea to have a couple of them so you can switch them out to allow for a good cleaning."

Backpacks are another culprit. Just think of where that backpack has been during the day – on the floor at school, stuffed in a rarely cleaned locker, or on the dirty bus (or bathroom) floor. Gross. Backpacks also carry food, wet or sweaty gym clothes, and lots of other things besides homework. Hoyano says you should help your kids establish a new routine to deal with everything in their backpack as soon as they get home. "Lunch containers can go right in the dishwasher or get washed in the sink, dirty gym clothes in the laundry, home work out, then hang the backpack where it is supposed to go, and wash hands before doing anything else."

One more to add to the "ick" factor – a study in the UK found nearly 1/5th of cell phones tested positive for E.Coli, a bacteria found in fecal matter. Not surprising, considering the majority of respondents to a survey admitted they texted or talked on the phone while in the bathroom. Cell phones and other devices are prime germ breeding grounds because they are warm, have lots of nooks and crannies, and don't get cleaned often. The best way to beat the bugs is to use antibacterial wipes to clean all handheld electronic devices every day!

Is there a writing project brewing in your imagination? The Museum at Campbell River once again offers its popular five-part Workshop for Aspiring Writers, starting October 16. It's designed as a kick start for a range of genres, from memoir and family history to fiction.

"Participants sample a variety of techniques in every class, applying what they learn to their own project," says Taylor. Writing begins in the first session," adds Taylor, "so come with a pretty well developed story idea or subject in mind."

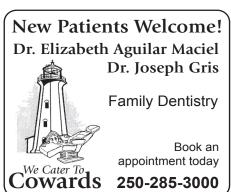
