Quadra Island is blessed with many talented musicians. Two of our local talent have formed a duo you are going to want to hear. "Easy Pickings" is John Toelle and Richard Christie: they play eclectic acoustic folk, rock, blues and country. Friday November 25 Easy Pickings performs in Herons at the Heriot Bay Inn.

John Toelle is a dazzling blues harmonica player who learned while traveling back roads as a teenager. In the 80's and 90's John started two Quadra Island bands; Dangerous Cargo and Crossover, playing local gigs and having a lot of fun. For two seasons he hosted the popular HBI monthly Folk nights, creating a venue for local skilled musicians. More recently he has concentrated on Voice and Guitar with the same passion he had building homes. He now plays harmonica and sings backup with the Ray Bennett Blues Band as well as collaborating with Richard Christie as Easy Pickings.

Since Richard Christie arrived on Quadra ten years ago he has performed with Quadra and Campbell River musical groups ranging from duos to larger ensembles. A versatile musician, Richard plays guitar, bass, drums and trumpet and worked in Vancouver for many years as a music educator. In recent months you may have spotted Richard performing with the Ray Bennett Band, Limbo Babies, Quadra Divas, John Toelle, Barry Hodgson, the Thievin Bros., or with Mo Davenport supporting local musicians at HBI open mic nights.

Another stormy November day! Forced me to stay inside and deal with office work. Now if the power will just stay on!

Life in local government these past weeks has been just incredible. I am not sure what is going on but there literally are not enough hours in any day to deal with all of the local issues, the Board issues and then the other lobbying issues that effect us. But I have to do it! It is second nature.

I mentioned in my last report about my successes at the UBCM Conference in the way of procuring \$1.4 million dollars in grant funding and \$550,000.00 in savings of Gas Tax money all for the Q. Cove sewer system. By the time you read this we will have finished the by-law process to proceed with the project now that we have the money in the bank. The plan is to have the 47 properties hooked up by June.

I also mentioned the other big grant that I was going after and I will repeat here to jog your memory:

"We had a failed application for funding for a seismic upgrade to the Quadra Community Centre last year even though we have been told by the province that we needed to do it. I met with Ministries and Ministers on this in the past year with no success. The main reason this is so important, other than the obvious, is that the Community Centre is our Emergency Response Reception Centre. We have reapplied for the grant which could go as high as \$500,000.00. While at UBCM I met with my good friend Minister Todd Stone (of Ferries fame). His Ministry is in charge of this file. I explained the dire situation to him and he was extremely receptive! (I almost died). He said "We need to take another look at this". He told me to be in touch when I got home from UBCM. So on Monday I sent an email to his office to get the process started. I got an email back the same day asking me to send a few lines describing the situation, which I did. I got an email reply the very next day (Tuesday) to say that they were working on setting up a meeting for me! Wow! Knock my socks off!. So as soon as I get a date, I will be heading to Victoria hoping for more money for Quadra!"

I only bring this up because my efforts at getting the meeting mentioned above have been successful and I meet with all the top brass at the Ministry of Transportation in Nanaimo on December 2nd. I am preparing a brief for their re-consideration and since the Ministry is sending people from Vancouver, Victoria and Nanaimo, I think they are seriously looking at a reconsideration of roughly \$400,000.00 dollars of needed money for the Community Centre seismic upgrades. Fingers, toes and eyes crossed, please! We really need that money since our tax base cannot support it.

Another positive piece of news is that the Annual User Fees for the Cove sewer system were slated to rise by about \$45.00 for this next year. I absolutely refused to allow it. Staff went back to the drawing board and came back with an even higher number. I had to once again refuse to allow it. According to our Chief Administrative Officer it is going to remain the same due to my objections. Great!

I am banking on the new 47 properties to add to the fees needed and cover the budget. We will run a small deficit this coming year and if my plan does not work.. well, then we have to raise the amount of the fees in the next year. I believe it is a safe gamble. We'll see. I hope you are with me on this. (This only effects the users within the Q. Cove Sewer District).

We have been having lots of fun with wharf issues in the outer islands. Delays on renovations to the Evans Bay wharf due to Federal bureaucracy, lease issues at Surge Narrows due to trespass. Lease issues at Owen Bay on Sonora Island due to senior government issues. The list goes on!

As an outer island issue, I would like to inform you of an email I got today after I filed a complaint with the SRD. The issue was a rezoning that brought in a packed house (over 60 people) at Surge Narrows regarding a proposal on North Rendezvous Island. The rezoning was turned down unanimously by the people and the Directors followed suit at the next Board meeting. End of story... not so fast.

So, the proponent did what he is entitled to do and went to the Board of Variance, which is a separate body from the SRD and we have no control over them. The email response I got in answer to my question on how this could happen, follows:

"Thank you for your email and concerns expressed. Please allow me to clarify a few points stemming from your email below.

The most important one is that the Board of Variance (BoV) hearing scheduled for tomorrow cannot be cancelled as it is imbedded in the Local Government Act (LGA) provisions and therefore has to continue as scheduled. To clarify the process, please note a few of the following sections of the act:

Under Division 15 of the Local Government Act (LGA), a Board of Variance (BoV) must be established by local governments that meet certain criteria. In meeting these criteria it is mandatory for the SRD to establish a BoV

with three members. The SRD met this legal obligation when earlier this year, the SRD Board appointed three members to serve on the BoV. The purpose of the BoV is to be a separate body that function independently from the SRD Board. Therefore officers and employees of SRD, members of APCs, and members the SRD Board are ineligible to be appointed to a BoV.

The applicant is not "by-passing the process" as indicated in your email below. This past year, the SRD received two different applications from Urban Wilderness:

• The first one was an application to amend the Area 'J' Rural Land Use Bylaw to rezone a portion of the foreshore to bring it into compliance with the subject Land Use Bylaw. The SRD Board did not support the proposed bylaw amendment. That file is closed.

• The second application that is now being processed, is a Board of Variance application, received in accordance with s.542 of the LGA to relieve hardship and allow an exemption from s 531 (1) [alteration or addition while non-conforming use continued].

Although it may not be the will of the Director or the Board, do know that the Regional District is bound by the LGA and does not have the authority to reject receipt of a BOV application."

I am sure that the people in the area will be terribly impressed should the Board of Variance come out in his favour. We can only wait and see. I have no control over the outcome.

Ongoing and upcoming issues include but are not limited to: still fighting the "Pay Parking" issue at our Hospitals (meeting of the Hospital Board on Thursday), meeting with residents and staff re: a water access sign placement in Open Bay; dealing with an Emergency boat dock and access in Open Bay in case of people being cut off (i.e. road collapse last month); The usual continual road issue complaints; of course our main Marine highway infrastructure called BC Ferries.

I will be attending Remembrance Day Ceremonies at the Legion; three days in Vancouver for the UBCM Executive as Director at Large; Attending as the SRD/ UBCM rep. on the Aquaculture Marine Advisory Committee of the Federal Govt. in Richmond. The SRD had a Governance workshop in Oyster Bay with a facilitator (so things wouldn't get too nasty!); Attended a two day meeting as the SRD rep. on the Marine Area Planning Partnership, a process of the Province and First nations along with stakeholders from all sectors.

I continue to plague companies about highspeed internet on the Island. Working on the implementation of the Q. Cove Village Plan with all parties to try and get it off the ground (and having some success).

The next two days will be spent in the Electoral Area Services Committee and the SRD Board meetings and then the Comox Valley Regional Solid Waste Committee and the Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District. Never a dull moment.

All of the other times are filled in talking to many of you on the phone or emailing. And I love it! So I am going to stop there since I have just made myself tired seeing all of this in one place!

Rachel Blaney, MP Raises Telus- Connectivity in House of Commons

Several Telus subscribers on Cortes and Quadra received a notice from Telus that their dial-up internet connection will be ended on November 16.

On Oct. 25, local MP Rachel Blaney asked the following question during Question Period in the House of Commons: "Mr. Speaker, instead of expanding access to broadband Internet, companies like Telus are actually disconnecting my constituents. As of November 16, residents of Cortes Island and parts of Quadra Island will have no Internet whatsoever. While we have seen some commitments on broadband, there seems to be zero funding for last-mile connection in rural Canada. What will the government do to prevent my constituents from being cut off from the Internet next month and to make sure that all rural Canadians have access to broadband?"

Navdeep Bains, the Minister of Innovation, Science and Economic Development, answered by talking about the federal government's longer-term plans about connectivity in rural regions of Canada, but his response did not address the urgent needs of Quadra and Cortes residents about their dialup service. As a result, Rachel Blaney has now written to the Minister and to the President and CEO of Telus, requesting a response and immediate action to ensure continued Internet service to these subscribers.

Emily Millard celebrates the release of her new album *By Heron & By Season* with a special concert in collaboration with fellow solo singer-songwriter David Simard.

Emily Millard is a Canadian singer/songwriter currently based in Montreal whose unique blend of art-folk has been called "inventive," "haunting" and "beautifully ethereal." Alchemically combining poetry with vintage keys, steel strings and found- instruments, Emily braves the space between silence and sound with her unmistakable voice.

Written over five years as a resident of Quadra Island's Bold Point community, Emily's new album By *Heron & By Season* is a colourful journey into the depths of memory and dreamscape. Produced by Sandro Perri, the album features some of Canada's most innovative instrumentalists including violinist Jesse Zubot (Tanya Tagaq), cellist Peggy Lee (Veda Hille), drummer Dan Gaucher (Fond Of Tigers, Woodpigeon) and bassist Colin Nealis (Andy Shauf).

David Simard has always imbued his work with a sense of space and a hint of nostalgia. Simard's arrangements evoke the landscapes he's studied and lived in, while his lyrics intimately relate the stories of characters met and imagined, along with more than a few of his own experiences.

The lyrical and musical makeup of The Heavy Wait is an effortless combination of gilded European elegance and small-town noir. Simard and his band recorded most of the album in a charged, live-off-the-floor session in Arcade Fire's old "Petite Eglise" studio. They dug in hard and deep to produce a quiet intensity so palpable and persistent that the album builds in strength with each passing track. Waves of horns and lap steel guitar, sparsely placed piano, and haunting clarinet lines, recorded later in Vancouver, rush to complement the live performances. "The Heavy Wait" was the band's chosen mantra during that first session and it persisted until the final note was captured.

An Exhibition and Sale of Richard Calver's Prints

In 1965 a wide-eyed youth from a rural English village stepped off a jet at Vancouver International Airport. Richard Calver had rarely travelled beyond the fields and hedgerows of home, but he was ready for change. And Canada drew him like a magnet, as a place to explore his intense love of nature.

Quadra Island became Richard's permanent home in the heyday of the Back-to the-Land movement. The time and place shaped his adult life and established him as an artist with a national following, but illness dictates a return to family in England in the new year. To celebrate his achievements, friends have organized a show and sale of his work on November 26 and 27.

Richard has a national following for his linocut prints, pulled by hand from blocks of meticulously inscribed slabs of linoleum. Four blocks are required for each print, to develop layers of image and gradations of colour and tone. It's a form he mastered under the tutelage of the late Sybil Andrews of Campbell River.

But half a century ago, when Richard first came to Canada, he didn't identify himself as an artist. He was a young man with a facility for drawing and for seeing—really seeing. It was on an acquaintance's chance mention that he sought out Sybil Andrews in her little cottage by the sea. Like Richard, Sybil was an English expat and though she lived in quiet retreat, she was an articulate and passionate professional artist. Richard joined her weekly studio sessions and art became the focus of his life.

"I'd never really been to an art class so this was all new to me," says Richard, recalling his first years with Sybil. She talked about her theories of art and ways to capture light, mood and feeling. 'Grab it while it's white hot,' she told her students. 'Put it down as violently as you can.'

"I was totally overwhelmed by it all," says Richard. "It was like I had jet lag, leaving her place, like being in another world."

Sybil rarely showed her work to her students, says Richard. She wanted them to develop their own vision and expression. And while Richard can see Sybil Andrews' influence November 26 & 27



in a few of his early pieces, his own deeply personal style emerged. His prints are loaded with narrative, in complex lines and subtle gradation of rich colour. He never approached this work as a career, which left him free to use them as a means to express his rich inner life. It also allowed him to devote the time needed to push this style of printmaking far beyond its early 20th century roots. Sybil and Richard shared a love of the English countryside and this theme permeates even his most recent work. But many of his 90-plus prints also reflect the forms and colours found in his garden, where he grows much of his own food year around. Some celebrate the tangled beauty of our forest and coast, and some are a plea for its protection.

"Does he realize how good he is," remarked an art collector on a visit to Sybil's studio during his early years with her. The man bought some of Richard's prints and it wasn't long before art galleries were in touch. Among them was Mayberry Fine Art of Winnipeg and Toronto, who is now Richard's exclusive dealer.

Richard added a studio and showroom to his home in Quathiaski Cove a decade ago, where a **celebratory show and sale takes place November 26 and 27, at 748 West Road** (next to the RCMP Station), from **1:00 to 4:00 p.m**.

Some prints will be available in frames, at no extra cost, and Richard hopes to be on hand for parts of the weekend.

Andrew Nikiforuk and Ian McAllister team up in honour of Roderick Haig-Brown

Two impassioned voices for environmental conservation will be joining together for an evening at the Tidemark Theatre in honour of early environmental activist and Campbell Riverite Roderick Haig-Brown.

This is the seventh in the Annual Haig-Brown Memorial Lecture series, This year's event is called "Two Measures of this Precious Coast". Andrew Nikiforuk will be presenting the lecture, "Why Haig-Brown Matters More than Ever", and Ian McAllister of Pacific Wild will be opening with a talk called "The Ocean Never Sleeps".
