Based on the novel Their Finest Hour and a Half by Lissa Evans, the film pops with witty banter and flows with lovely period detail. QUADRA PHILIPPINE CONNECTIONS

Stuffies and wardrobes and books, oh my! This year's Giant Garage Sale is another record breaker!

After 20 hours over two days of leaning over the book tables, I am an exhausted but happy volunteer as we put the 2017 Philippines Here's an open box Garage Sale behind us! I am feeling my age so will be looking for young helpers next year, wink. I continue to be amazed at the way community members pitch in to pull this event out of the bag year after year. Huge thanks to all involved.

Before you keeners line up at the crack of dawn to get first pick of the items, scores of volunteers spend a long day setting up. At 9am Saturday, the able-bodied start hauling and setting up tables. Much discussion

about where the strong wooden tables are needed and which rows of goods can be set out on the lighter tables. What is the most strategic use of the card tables? Someone thinks to wash off leftover stickiness. Are the aisles wide enough? At the south end of the hall, the clothing crew is assembling the racks for hanging clothing and unboxing hangers, which have somehow become tangled messes in spite of having been carefully stowed all year. A few brave folk are climbing ladders to suspend the giant clothesline from QCC's beautiful timber posts, a job which requires plenty of supervision and direction from the experts below. Someone thoughtful is in the kitchen warming up the coffee machine, boiling kettles and setting out water pitchers and coffee fixin's. Soon, the first of the trucks full of donations arrive from the collection points. Strong folk to the stage door to unload furniture! Able hands to unload bags and boxes from the trucks at the north door! The outside crew quickly direct items to be

set up under the covered entry or to be taken inside. It's crucial to keep the goods moving away from the door to the designated aisles so there isn't a traffic jam. Are these bags of clothing heavier than last year? Soon the hall floor looks like a squashed anthill with people scurrying every which way, each with a purposeful gleam in their eye.

And now, the part we all love, because it's kind of like a birthday party... opening the bags and boxes and loading them onto tables. Delighted laughter. Shouts of "Isn't that cute!" or "My Dad has one like that!" echo through the air... for about ten minutes. Then you realize that the stuff to unload just keeps coming and the glamour wears off. At some point you straighten up from unpacking and realize that a cup of coffee is calling you. Quick break and you are back at it. More unpacking, rearranging the table to accomodate more items. Them the welcome call: "Lunch is here." We storm the kitchen counter like a bunch of hungry children,

devour the pizzas and chocolate, moan a bit about how much work this is, then get back at it. People sure are generous! So... Much... Stuff. By 4pm I have lost track of how many great books there are, but we are determined to get as many as possible organized and displayed for your purchasing pleasure. At 6, I decide that book lovers will enjoy rooting through a few boxes looking for treasures and call it quits. Home for supper and a hot shower, and early to bed. We need to be at the hall on sale day before 9am because that's when the shopping keeners will start showing up to find that all-important special item!

This year, we were encouraged by a very special visitor: Remy Bainto, IAT's social worker and program coordinator from the Philippines. IAT is the parent organization for the programs which we fund via the Giant Garage Sale. This is Remy's first time away from the Philippines. On her fifth day in Canada, she was still jet lagged and tired but happy to to directly experience our fundraising efforts and participate in the giant

garage sale. She expressed surprise at our effort and spirit of cooperation as well as appreciation for Quadra's support of IAT programs and the positive impact our funds have had. She enjoyed conversing with both volunteers and shoppers who told her of their own appreciation of the garage sale. She heard that not only does it help to connect Quadra with communities in the Philippines, but also connects us with each other as we work together for this great cause (and even end up sharing and wearing each other's belongings!). Remy will be on Vancouver Island until the end of December and we look forward to bringing her back to Quadra for a presentation and community potluck!

The Giant Garage Sale is a huge effort for charity and every donor, shopper and volunteer is essential. Here are some really important thanks and acknowledgements: the families who offered their homes as drop-off locations prior to the sale; the drivers

who transferred donations from the drop-offs to QCC, and at the end from the sale to various thrift and recycling centres, thankfully not in the rain this year; Tru Value Foods both locations - for changing Spirit Board points into cash and cooking our pizzas; Gabriella for beautiful posters; Aroma Coffee Roasters; Strathcona Regional District and Waste Management for helping us deal with the unsold items; WMM for the huge dumpster that transports the remains to the landfill; BC Ferries for giving free transport to Waste Management to bring and return the dumpster; and all of the bakers, sorters, labourers, and cashtakers. All in all, that's about 100 people!

Quadra RCMP Report

Fraud: Quadra RCMP continue to get reports of various frauds in our area. The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) fraud is still continuing in which the fraudsters call you or leave you a message that you owe money and that you will be arrested if you don't pay them money. There is also another recent fraud in which a credit card company calls you advising that they can lower your credit card interest rate from 19% down to 6% which sounds too good to be true... and it is, because it's fraud. The fraudster attempts to get you to give them your credit card information so they can go on a shopping spree with your credit card information.

Found: The Quadra RCMP has had an iPhone 5 and a set of binoculars turned into the detachment. If you are missing either of these items please contact the Quadra RCMP so we can reunite you with your property.

SCD was also included in her school's curriculum, so it was no surprise when Robin decided to take the necessary examinations to become a registered teacher.

Since then Robin has taught class regularly, as well as guest teaching at various workshops all over North America, and now teaches a class on Quadra.

Each well designed class offers a delightful combination of dances to suit all abilities some to challenge more experienced dancers, others geared specifically for beginners, all equally enjoyable. In fact, Robin says, no matter what their level of experience, students frequently tell her how refreshed they feel after a class, and how very much they enjoyed it.

The basic steps are not difficult, and once learned, students can concentrate on mastering the intricacies of each dance pattern in a friendly, relaxed atmosphere. If you can keep time with music, you can Scottish Country Dance! And as for those questions - any smooth-soled flexible comfortable shoes will

do, although of course you can buy SCD shoes if you wish. Dances are done in pairs, but you don't need to bring your own partner. Or wear a kilt (only advanced and/or competitive dancers do that), or be Scottish. Just bring your sense of fun and let the music and Robin's excellent and detailed instruction do the rest you'll be dancing before you know it!

REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT • News from Area C by Jim Abram

Well, Fall has finally arrived, officially! It has felt like Fall for some time. At least the fire danger has lessened!

This is going to be a very short report. I did say in the last report that it would be the last one for September, but events have changed that.

As many of you already know, the Bylaw (271) for Quadra Links was to finally come up at our meeting this past week and it was on the agenda.


Please let me back up for a second. There have been a lot of rumblings about the Regional District 'stalling' the process. This could not be farther from the truth. 'Life' got in the way for one of our Directors who also happens to be the Chair of the Board. He had to cancel the July Board meeting for personal reasons and then again had to cancel the August Board meeting for family reasons. Both of these cancellations were his prerogative and the Directors and the staff had nothing to do with them.I realize it was a hold up for the applicants but nothing could be done about it.

So, back to the Committee meeting last Wednesday. I am going to copy exactly what it said on our agenda page for clarity just below:

Bylaw no 271 Quadra Island Rezoning (Quadra Links)

a) That the report from the Chief Administrative Officer be received. (the report: https://agenda.strathconard.ca/public/minutes.asp?id=81&AgendaType=2& MeetingDate=9/20/2017&MeetingType=75) b) That the Committee recommend that the report on the Public Hearing for Bylaw 271 held on June 21 and 22, 2017, together with all supporting documentation, be received by the Regional Board.

THAT the Board recommend that a second public hearing be convened to introduce additional information with respect to Bylaw No. 271 and seek further public input.



The most unfortunate thing for me is that I am still bound by the Local Government Act provision that prohibits me from talking about the issue until the Board has dealt with the recommendation. That will happen on October 11th at 12:30 pm and all material will then be public and I will be able to speak (as far as I know!).

I think I can say this much: New, relevant information came to staff and it was decided that the information needed to be given to the Directors before they could make a determination on the Bylaw. So, full stop of the process! Hence the hold up.

I have requested that staff develop a report for that meeting that does not just include going to a second public hearing but will provide other options also. I have no idea what they might come up with but we will see then and hopefully it is less painful than another public hearing. I came to the Committee meeting totally prepared to deal with the topic, just in case we were allowed to. That didn't happen, so here we are, in waiting mode once again.

I am reporting what I feel I can so that the rumours that are flying around the island right now will be kept to a minimum.

UBCM meetings

I am leaving for UBCM tomorrow morning (Saturday the 23rd) (I have written this report early so you would have some news on the Committee meeting)

At this point I am meeting with nine Ministers or ministries on very important topics for Area C. The only meeting that I was unable to secure was a meeting with our MLA, the Minister of Transportation. Hopefully I can accomplish the same by running into her at one of the receptions or in the hall.

Seniors Housing rezoning

I am very pleased to announce that the Bylaw for the Seniors Housing complex went to the first two readings and now we will set a date for a public hearing. This is a direct result of the Local Area Plan that we all worked so hard and long on and a direct result on the dedication and hard work of a core group of volunteers that have been dealing with the actual project for the past couple of years.. This is part of the "Ageing in Place" theme that we hear so much about and should allow at least sixteen couples or individuals to stay on the island for as long as they like rather than be forced off by the fact that they can no

longer maintain their larger properties and may need some type of assistance in their daily life. I am very proud of our community for bringing this portion of the Local Area Plan to fruition.

Pathways

We also passed a resolution to complete the path from Nole Road to Plaza Road along the public utility corridor that was put in place to facilitate the sewer extension project. I was pleased to be able to approve the allocation of Community Works Funds (Gas Tax) which I have been 'saving in the bank', to allow this project to proceed without any property taxation. Another amenity for the larger community is being implemented due to the sewer extension project in the Cove. Our next project (which has already begun) is to put in the pathway from the Library area to the area by Aroma along Harper Road, but off of the road.

This will be so nice for all the people that want to walk, stroll or bike along Harper Road without having to put their lives in their hands. This is also a part of the Local Area Planning process being realized.

So that is going to be it for this report as I still have many things to do to prepare for my trip to UBCM. Arzeena worked abroad for many years as a CUSO volunteer in Thailand and as a researcher in Jamaica, India, and Bangladesh. She was the staff agrologist for West Coast Seeds in the late 90s and ran her own seed company, Terra Viva Organics. From 2008 to 2012 Arzeena was the Coordinator of the Richmond Food Security Society where she oversaw a number of community projects which included a proposal to the City of Richmond to declare itself a GMO-Free Zone. In 2015, Arzeena was one of the founding members of Merville Organics Growers Cooperative, a marketing

co-operative based in the Comox Valley. Merville Organics operates a 120-share CSA and sells through through farmers markets. She is owner/operator of Amara Farms in Courtenay, BC.

WHAT'S HAPPENING ON QUADRA

Discover the secret lives of fungi at the Quadra Island Wild Mushroom Festival!

We're all glad to see the autumn rains finally arrive, especially those of us waiting eagerly for the Quadra Mushroom Festival on October 13, 14 and 15.

The Festival starts with a presentation (followed by tasty mushroom appies) on Friday evening at the Heriot Bay Inn, by noted mycologist Dr. Shannon Berch. "For many of us, chanterelles are those beautiful and delicious golden trumpets that beckon from across the dark and humid forest floor. However, the chanterelle fungus is much

more - mediator, combatant, and prey," says Dr. Berch. "In this presentation, we will explore what's really going on in the forest, out of sight and underground."

the basis for Sunday's introduction to mushroom identification, a hands-on, interactive workshop, to discover the basics



Steph Cameron at the HBI Pub Oct. 16

Steph Cameron's music and lifestyle seem to echo another time and place. Think of the beatniks in the 50s, hitchhiking and hopping freight trains – or perhaps a late 60s commune in northern California. Lyrically, Steph's songs dig deep, drawing upon the experiences and lessons learned from a fascinatingly nomadic and sometimes turbulent lifestyle. Cameron is a Saskatoon-raised singer and songwriter whose debut record was long-listed for the Polaris Prize in 2015.

Born in Saskatoon, she has since spent time living in East Vancouver, Vancouver Island, and the Kootenay region of BC, as well as logging serious miles traversing the country. Cameron finds creative sustenance in living simply, for the last several years in cabins she has built herself. "My dog and I used to live in an 8 by 8 foot shanty I built in the bush on Vancouver Island. In the winter, when the rain would beat down on the tin roof, it sounded like a drum. I wrote 'Goodbye Molly' about the rhythm of the rain and the feeling of water rising all around me."

Many Quadra Islanders can doubtless relate to hearing music in the rhythm of rain on a roof. Hear Steph Cameron's folk music / storytelling as her coastal tour lands her in the HBI Pub Monday October 16. No cover charge for this show, and it's an early start: 8pm, perfect for a moody Monday evening.
