FOOD FOR THOUGHT

nder the canopy of an evergreen forest, it's hard to let your mind stick to the weighty plights of humankind. Tenacious ferns launching from every available ounce of dirt and huckleberries spraying out of old nurse logs show the resilience of nature, pushing back without hesitation against the abrupt changes made by humans. It's inspiring, in a way, amidst all the damage we are doing around ourselves, to see life plowing onwards with voracity. So long as you're not too attached to the human race, climate change and all that comes with it doesn't seem so dire. Of course, adaptability takes eons and most plants might not be able to keep up to the rapid shift we've started... but it seems a plausible vision that blackberries will happily consume my yard once nobody is left to fend them off! We are lucky to be cradled in this far-reaching nest of healing photosynthesis. I believe in the flora! Another marvellously persistent and trendy life form is the wondrous sourdough. It feels almost vogue to even talk about it these days, but it's one of those trends that I can roll with and feel like I'm not compromising any personal integrity. This gurgling homemade concoction is so simple to start, diverse to use, and divine to eat. Not only can you get springy, lightly tangy, sometimes cavernous loaves of bread, but it's actually good for you. The bacteria in the sourdough culture "predigests" the flour, making it easier for the gut to handle in digestion. As well, the wild yeasts and bacteria reduce the phytic acid (which inhibits proper absorption of nutrients) found in all grains, giving us increased access to the minerals found in the wheat we use so commonly. Digestibility improves when you use ancient grains flours, such as spelt, einkorn, and kamut, to name just a few. All this alongside the most heavenly thing you could put underneath hot butter, ooh lordy! Say no more!

Actually wait, yes, do say more!! Once you've built yourself a sourdough starter (the research I will leave up to you, as it depends on which flour you'd prefer to use), you'll find yourself with enough sourdough to swim in. Some recipes say to toss the remainder -DO NOT! There are a thousand and one "discard" recipes out there, each as divine as the original loaf of bread you had in mind. A friend of mine told me she keeps her starter well fed in a gallon jar, to have enough around to make all kinds of tasty vittles. The new Saturday morning favourite in our household is overnight sourdough waffles! I can hardly Friday evening: feed your starter, if you didn't this morning - it still works! Then mix 1 cup starter, 1 c buttermilk (or 3/4 c yogurt* + 1/4 c milk), 1 c flour, and 1 Tbs sugar*. Mix well - this is your sponge. Cover and let rest on the counter overnight.

Saturday morning: fire up your waffle maker! Uncover sponge, add 1/4 c melted butter, 1 egg, 1 tsp vanilla, 1/4-1/2 tsp salt, and 1 tsp baking soda. Whisk until blended (it will be a bit goopy). When the waffle iron is hot enough that the batter sizzles on contact, oil it if necessary then pour 1/3-1/2 cup batter in (depending on the size of your iron, of course) and close. Make waffles according to your iron. The lid will open easily with no resistance when the waffles are done. Remove waffles and try to serve with dignity - mine rarely make it off the stove top without a tear or a bite (quality control, right?). Top as you please (or don't, they truly hold their own! But with butter, always with butter).

*if I have it, I'll use vanilla yogurt and skip the additional sugar.

Sourdough is an inspiring life force, seemingly difficult to kill and impressively diverse in its applications. Like the plants flourishing in the forest or the algae breathing in the sea, this helpful and delicious bacteria is just another example of the charge of life, churning and pulsing and processing an existence on this special planet.

PUBLIC ART

n a mission to reach out and embrace the community of Quadra Island during the recent global Covid-19 pandemic, Kevin Mackenzie, Islander and renowned metalwork artist, has created a sculpture he hopes will bring joy and happiness to the otherwise grey days we have been faced with .

The larger than life-sized sculpture, fittingly entitled "Silver Lining" is set to find a forever home in the community hub of Quathiaski Cove at the plaza.

"When people get off the ferry and come to the top of the hill, I want them to see what Quadra is all about and that they are in a nice place and we're a nice community and a loving community and that we are

peaceful here," says Mackenzie. The sculpture simply "belongs to Quadra," he adds.

For Mackenzie, the art piece is a testament to the fabric of a strong, collective community and a symbol of the strength in overcoming adversity. He says he witnessed how depressed Islanders where at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic and made it his goal to spread joy through this gift to the Island.

" I was on social media and I noticed how upset people were, they were crying and depressed and anxious," says Mackenzie. " So it made me wonder what I could do to make people happier and smile and bring some light? And while I was thinking about this I was doodling," he explains.

From his doodles, Mackenzie conceptualized what he hoped would

breathe calming energy into those who will see the sculpture.

Complete with the universal heart and a peace symbol, Mackenzie and creative partner and fellow Islander, bambam, incorporated an array of local flower species including daisies, sunflowers, a trillium, foxglove, lilies and an orchid, as well as some cute and whimsical creatures of nature, or " critters" as the artist refers.

In a call for local input prior to execution, Mackenzie summoned ideas from Island residents, asking what flowers they would like placed in the design.

"Because the community took such a part in donating and helping me get this finished I thought that the least I could do was to have some input on what they wanted, says Mackenzie.

He says the outpouring of support has been huge, adding that he's answered community wishes regarding flower choices as best he could. The artist also went on social media requesting Islanders name the sculpture and from the request a cornucopia of ideas came until a title was chosen and fitting.

Mackenzie, who has put over a hundred hours into the piece, says he is grateful to to the community for the flood of support and financial donations since blossoming the idea to fruition just over a month ago. He also put a few of his larger sculptures up for auction on Facebook to offset execution costs.

" I hope everyone takes away from this that peace and love and

community is still alive in these times," he says.

" At this particular time in history it's significant," adds bambam.

"Wellbeing isn't a value encased in capitalism. So given that we are collectively vulnerable I feel this sculpture and it's meaning symbolizes a transition out of what could become a really dark situation," she explains.

" I hope this sculpture holds its meaning and that meaning will be carried forward in time, she adds.

"I feel very grateful to have been able to contribute to something on a community scale."

The approximately 7 foot tall by 6 foot wide sculpture weighs in at over 500 pounds. It was crafted with 8 inch stainless steel plate throughout, with the floral aspects created in

a lighter gauge metal.

"It brings happiness and speaks to our community. When you see it you immediately smile," says MacKenzie.

The sculpture is a beacon illuminating that amid the darkness of our current time there is a ray of light, and in this case, a beautiful "Silver Lining".

The official public unveiling date for the sculpture is June 5th at 12 noon in the Quathiaski Cove plaza. The artist will be presenting to the Chamber of Commerce a certificate of Quadra ownership of the sculpture. Everyone is Welcome. Social distancing please.

My name is Maese Shea and my escort is Fionn Lenahan. I would like to thank last year's May Queen, Hazel Neri Eley for her year's reign. I would also like to acknowledge that Rebecca Spit is on the traditional land of the We Wai Kai Nation.

May Day is different this year due to the pandemic COVID-19 and although we can't be together, we can celebrate in spirit and share our creativity on-line within the theme of "Metamorphosis."

A May Day In the 1900's once wowed the people with a gramophone, a record player with an umbrella like speaker and now we further metamorphosize by doing May Day speeches virtually with video!

I hope today you can still spread a blanket and have a picnic with your family. A tradition Quadra Islanders have done since 1897 when we celebrated Queen Victoria of England's birthday. People dressed up in their finest and spread tablecloths on the green grass of Rebecca Spit and covered them with good things to eat. A story from long ago tells the tale of these ghost like picnic blankets spooking a team of oxen and horses so they would not budge. This made all the riders and those behind them on the narrow road to the Spit late for the celebration. A situation my family can relate to in trying to be on time for the 10 o'clock parade.

Rebecca Spit wasn't a BC provincial park back then but Maxwell's Chicken Farm and its owners were listed as "Chicken Fanciers" which may explain why we like to dress up in fancy costumes on May Day?

Times sure have changed ... just like the May Day races and although we still have the traditional three Legged and Spoon Races we no longer have the "Pipe Race" where men ran to a line, lit a pipe and had to finish with it still smoking.

Races have always been one of my favourite parts of May Day. I remember in Kindergarten being called the "Pink Blur" as I ran in my best sundress to a blue ribbon. It was the only time I beat my escort, Fionn Lenahan, in the Sprint as he trained for the rest of the year and has beat me ever since.



I will miss the Fort Building contest and the May Pole dancers but most of all I will miss getting together with my neighbours, friends and community. I look forward to the day when we can parade and picnic again. Happy May Day everyone!

All observations made in the Discovery Islands region will be automatically added to the Discovery Islands Biodiversity Project. Observations made within Rebecca Spit, Surge Narrows, or any other Discovery Islands provincial park will also contribute to the BC Parks iNaturalist Project, led by the Hakai Institute's partners at UVic and SFU.


